Housing

- More than \$14,000 was distributed to provide housing stabilization in Greater Sullivan County
- Support included rental assistance, emergency housing, groceries & utilities



Electric & Fuel Assistance

 More than \$14,100 was distributed to provide electric & fuel assistance for residents of Greater Sullivan County



Childcare

- More than \$1,700 was distributed to support childcare in Greater Sullivan County
- Families partnered with TLC Family Resource Center for childcare



Transportation

- More than \$7,500 was distributed to support transportation in Greater Sullivan County
- This included bus passes and last mile taxi services

"Your recent COVID-19 donation is a life changing gift that gives seniors access to the most important necessity in life, food. COVID-19 has created many challenges and demands while preparing and delivering meals to older adults.

Your donation has assisted us with meeting some of these challenges and additional requirements needed to provide a safe environment for those we serve and our staff during the pandemic.

We recently received a letter from a Meals-on-Wheels (m.o.w.) participant who had been experiencing many health issues resulting in her dropping weight to a dangerously low weight of just 69 pounds.

Since receiving m.o.w., she credits our program for helping her achieve a healthier weight of 90 pounds and because she continues to receive a daily, nutritious meal, she is now also able to maintain the weight she has not been able to maintain for the past two years.

Together, we can continue to change lives. We couldn't do it without you and look forward to fighting against senior hunger in the future."



Community Relief Fund, River Valley Community College was able to distribute 1200 grab and go snacks/ lunch items during the months of October, November and December of 2020. With your generous contribution, we were able to distribute snacks within 10 days of being made aware of the increasing need. During the same time frame, RVCC made 4,652 lbs of food from the NH Food Bank available to students. The 1200 snacks met a unique and specific need for our students (that was not met by the NH Food Bank food) who are food insecure. Those juggling student schedules, parenting duties, and work obligations were able to eat "on the go" thanks to the funding that you all provided.
